Session Overview:

Are you familiar with the term, "use of self as a tool"? Have you ever wanted to increase your self awareness and align this awareness with a greater capacity to understand and influence individual and organizational dynamics? Directions & Map to Universal Orlando

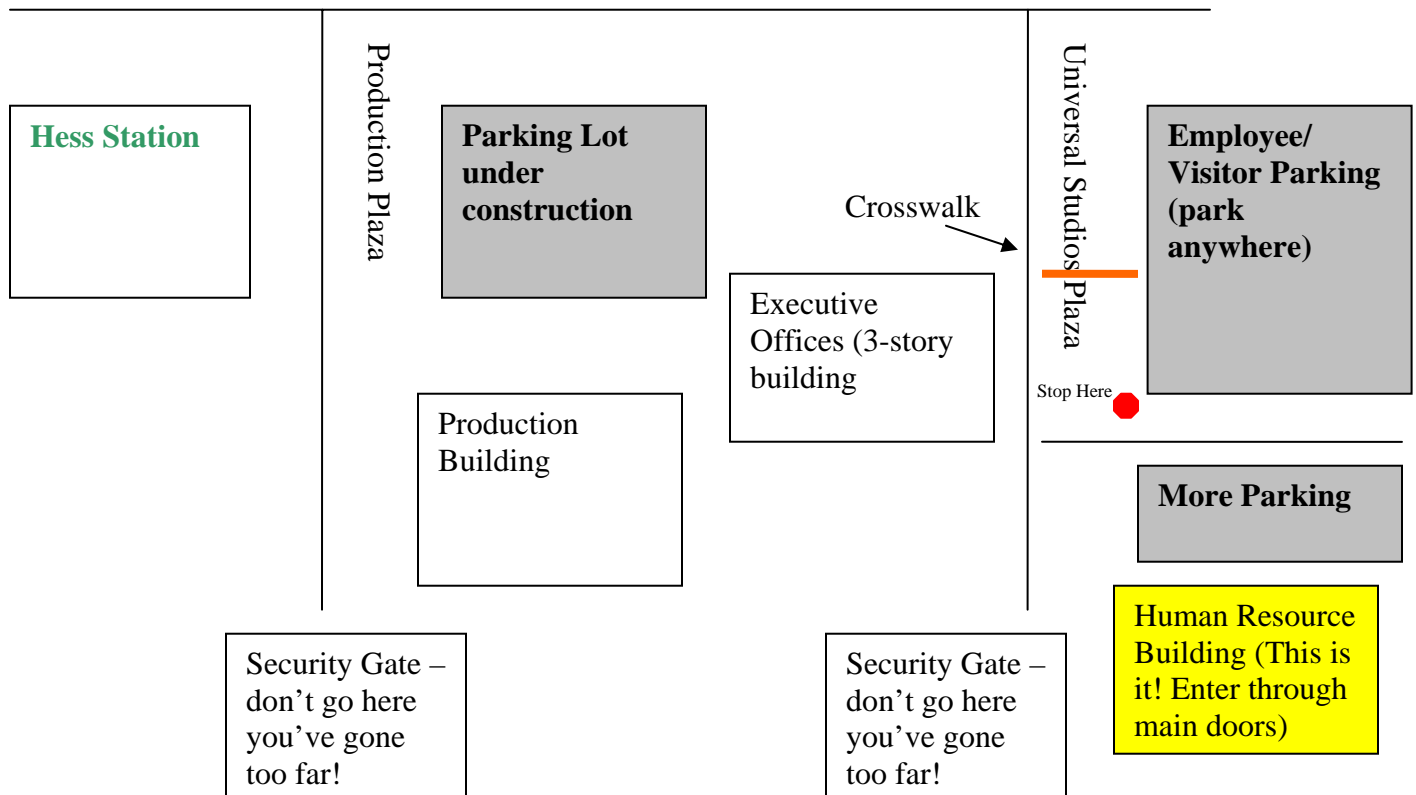
PLEASE NOTE. You will need your driver's license to enter. The security guard will exchange your license for a visitor's security ID sticker. The exchange will be reversed when you leave.

Directions to Universal Orlando Human Resources Building (from Downtown Orlando)

Take I-4 West to the Universal exit. This exits to the right. Come to the stoplight at Hollywood Way. Turn left on Hollywood Way. Come to the stoplight at Turkey Lake Road. Turn right. Take Turkey Lake Rd. to Universal Studios Plaza (past Hess station and construction on right). Turn right. Proceed to stop sign. Turn left into large parking lot. You will see the Human Resources building off to your right. It is a blue and yellow one-story building labeled Human Resources in large letters. You can park in any parking space except for specifically designated spaces. Come to and enter through the front Lobby.

Directions to Universal Orlando Human Resources (from Kissimmee/Disney)

Take the Sand Lake Road exit, make a left onto Sand Lake Road and then an immediate right at the 7-Eleven onto Turkey Lake Road. Take Turkey Lake Rd. to Universal Studios Plaza (past Hess station and construction on right). Turn right. Proceed to stop sign. Turn left into large parking lot. You will see the Human Resources building off to your right. It is a blue and yellow one-story building labeled Human Resources in large letters. You can park in any parking space except for specifically designated spaces. Come to and enter through the front Lobby.
